"Bhimbetka is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, a group of rock-shelter paintings and an archeological treasure. (The name 'Bhimbetka' mean the "setting place of Bhim" a hero-deity of epic Mahabharat. Bhimbetka lie 45 km South of Bhopal. The rock shelters and caves of Bhimbetka have a large number of paintings made with vegetable colour, which have endured through time. The oldest paintings are considered to be 30,000 years old. The rock shelter exhibit the earliest traces of human life on the Indian sub-continent. The paintings in 500 cave mainly executed in red and which with occassional use of green and yellow depict them from deity life of that age. The entire area is covered with thick vegetation, perennial water supplies, natural shelters, rich forest flore and fauna

and bear, a striking resemblance to similar rock art sites such as Kakadu National Park in Australia, the cave paintings of Bushmen in Kalahari desert in the upper paleolithic Lascaur cave paintings in France. Bhimbetka was first mentioned in Indian archaeological records in 1888. Later V. S. Wakankar, while travelling by train to Bhopal saw some rock formation similar to those he had seen in Spain and France. He visited the area with a team of archaeologists and discovered several prehistoric rock shelters in 1957."
